- Be able to cope with challenge and change.
- Have a sense of justice.
- Develop a sense of responsibility.

## To be listened to means to:

- Adults close to children recognize their need to express their thoughts, feelings and ideas.
- Adults close to children can read their body language, verbal and non-verbal language to understand what they are trying to communicate.
